NSFAS is a public entity under the **Department of Higher Education and Training**. NSFAS provides
financial help through study bursaries to deserving
students at **TVET colleges** and **public universities**.

The funding covers the cost of registration, tuition as well as allowances for **learning material**, **food, personal care, transport** or **accommodation**.

Who qualifies for funding?

- South African citizens or permanent residents
- SASSA grant recipients
- Applicants whose combined gross household income is not more than R350 000 per year
- Persons living with disabilities whose combined gross household income is not more than R600 000 per year.



Who should not apply?

 Students who have already applied and received funding in previous years, have not as yet graduated on their current qualification and do not intend to change from one sector to another (TVET College to University or vice versa). They are automatically funded for the duration of their studies, provided they pass their modules and meet the academic requirements.

NSFAS will validate the ID upfront. This will allow us to evaluate your application with the validated and correct information received from the Department of Home Affairs **(DHA)**, South African Social Security Agency **(SASSA)**, Department of Basic Education **(DBE)** and others.

Benefits for applicants

- User-friendly application form that you can complete anytime, anywhere, on a mobile device.
- Reduce time spent on completing an application.
- Improve the accuracy of the application through data validation of fields.

Required documents

Note:

- O If you are a SASSA recipient, then no proof of income is required.
- O Certified documents are not a requirement

Required documents

All applicants

- · Copy of ID
- ID copies of parent(s), guardian or spouse
- Proof of income of parent(s), guardian or spouse (payslip or appointment letter, where applicable)

Note: If you are a **SASSA** recipient, then no proof of income is required. **Certified documents are not a requirement**

Based on the application type, the system will generate a list of required documents for upload.

Required documents

Students living with disabilities must provide:

• A completed and signed Disability Annexure A Form (available on the website)

Students recognised as vulnerable child must provide:

An applicant who is recognised as a vulnerable child by the Department of Social Development must provide completed and Vulnerable Child Declaration form completed by a social worker (available on the website)

Students –(non-SASSA) who has indicated no family members details must provide:

An applicant who has indicated that s/he has no family member details and or abridged birth certificate must complete the Non-SASSA Declaration Form (available on the website)

Other documents required, if applicable:

- · Retrenchment letter
- · Death certificate/s: Divorce decree

Note: No affidavits or copy of driver's license will be accepted as proof of ID
